- Volunteering: Volunteering with charities across Canada





Pillars of Focus

Our Foundation was established with four Pillars of Focus, allowing us to focus our efforts on creating meaningful change.

Our four pillars are:



Every two years, all FCR staff and Foundation members vote on a pillar of focus for the upcoming two year term.

When we launched our Foundation during the pandemic in 2020/2021, we focused on the **Food Insecurity & Poverty** pillar. We supported **Canadian food banks** for 2020 and selected **Second Harvest** as our signature partner for 2021. 2021 also saw our first signature event; a walk in our neighbourhoods.

At the end of 2021, our staff voted to select **Mental Health** as the **pillar of focus for 2022 and 2023.** We have spent the last two years supporting **Kids Help Phone** as our signature partner for this pillar. This two-year term has been a period of growth for the Foundation, seeing the launch of our CRE Softball Classic and the expansion of Foundation events across Canada.




Year in Review

By focusing on one pillar over a two-year period, we are able to dedicate significant time and effort to our signature charity partner, and are able to build upon our support for our neighbourhoods year after year. For 2022 and 2023, our target was to raise \$450,000 over this two year term. We're very proud to report that we've passed that goal, raising a total of \$536,750 for Kids Help Phone in the last two years.

Building on our Success

We're building a plan to grow our Foundation pillar by pillar.



2023 Milestones:



We're pleased to report the final results of our programming for 2023:

- \$339,750 donated to Kids Help Phone and their Councillor in the Classroom program
- 1,756 hours of volunteer time contributed
- Over 2,100 pounds of food, plus additional barrels and bags of toys and clothing raised for various charities through FCR properties
- Over 40 community organizations and non-profits supported

2023 Programming

2023 was our second year partnering with <u>Kids Help Phone</u>. With the \$339,750 we've raised through our fundraising initiatives this year, we've been supporting their <u>Counsellor in the Classroom</u> program.

Kids Help Phone is a national organization dedicated to providing mental health support to Canadian children and youth.

Their Counsellor in The Classroom program is an innovative and community-based program designed to help students in Grades 4 through 12 connect with Kids Help Phone and learn about mental health. The program's goal is to empower young people and build resilience.

Second Annual CRE Softball Classic

On September 21, 2023, we held the second annual **Commercial Real Estate Softball Classic** at Toronto's Coronation Park. FCR staff and industry peers came together to enjoy a day of softball, featuring live music, a 50:50 lottery, a beer garden and lunch courtesy of our tenant Burger Drops.

- \$221.000* raised







Montreal Bowling Event

On November 3, 2023, our Montreal Team held the Foundation's first regional fundraising event.

Hosted at Salle de Quilles Fleury, an FCR tenant, the team put together an enjoyable afternoon of bowling.

The event featured bowling, as well as delicious eats, a raffle for box seats at a Montreal Canadiens game, and a photobooth. We were delighted to be joined by Karine Couture Bienvenue, a Kids Help Phone counsellor who spoke to attendees about her experiences answering calls from youth at KHP.

Edmonton Bowling Tournament

On November 16, 2023, our Edmonton Team hosted a bowling tournament at Plaza Bowling Co.

The cool retro vibe of the venue, 50:50 lottery, raffle for Edmonton Oilers tickets, and delicious food donated by FCR tenants (Crumbl Cookies, D Spot, Seoul Fried Chicken, and Wing Snob) all made for an unforgettable evening!

- 19 donors
- \$8,500* raised





Calgary 50:50 and Raffle

Our Calgary Team had two fundraising initiatives for the Foundation in 2023! They kicked off with a 50:50 lottery at Deer Valley Market Place's annual Calgary Stampede Caravan Pancake Breakfast.

At the end of the year, a Holiday Raffle was held for the public, featuring a range of prizes generously donated by FCR tenants and suppliers.

Calgary's giving spirit didn't end there.
The team organized their own fundraiser:
playing some holiday games in the office
to raise funds and food for the Calgary
Food Bank.

- 21 donors
- \$5,000* raised





Property Charitable Initiatives

Many of First Capital REIT's properties partook in their own charitable initiatives in 2023. For each property, their contribution was unique and tailored to their own objectives, highlighting FCR's investment in the communities we serve.

Support ranged from donating space, making financial contributions, hosting donation bins and more. Some examples of these initiatives include:

Holiday Food & Toy Drives:

- Feed Scarborough: 580 lbs of food (Cedarbrae Mall & Parkway Mall)
- Community Care: 100 lbs of food, 2 barrels of toys, and 15 bags of clothing (Fairview Mall)
- Eden Food for Change: 687 lbs of food (Meadowvale Town Centre)
- Daily Bread Food Bank: 80 lbs of food (Humbertown Shopping Centre)
- 630 CHED Santas Anonymous: 52 bags of toys from Northgate (23), Westmount (7) and Meadowlark (22)
- Nelson House of Ottawa-Carleton: collected 4 shopping carts full of gifts (Merivale Mall)

Ad Hoc Property Events:

- Humbertown BBQ, May 13th: \$1020 raised and 49 non-perishables collected for Daily Bread Food Bank
- Merivale Drive-In, Sept 9: Raised \$629.10 and a full bag of non-perishables for Nelson House of Ottawa-Carlton
- Meadowvale Drive-In, August 19th: \$358.35 and 642 lbs of non-perishables for Eden Food for Change

Volunteer Days

In 2023, we continued our Staff Volunteer Days Program, ensuring all employees have the opportunity to give back to their communities.

The Foundation's Volunteer Day subcommittee works year-round to identify and arrange opportunities for staff to volunteer.

In April 2023, the subcommittee organized National Volunteer Week activities, with 120 staff contributing over 470 volunteer hours that week.

FCR's corporate objective for 2023 was to have at least 85% of our staff use their volunteer day. Staff rose to the challenge, **achieving 93% participation**.

Some of the charitable organizations supported in 2023 include: Grow Calgary, Holly's Haven Wildlife Rescue, Moisson Montreal, Ronald McDonald Children's House Edmonton, Simcoe Muskoka Regional Cancer Centre, SKETCH Working Arts, and the Surrey Food Bank.

Key highlights:

- 1750+ volunteer hours from FCR staff
- 80+ organizations supported
- \$58,900+ economic impact from volunteering*

Case Study: Connecting with Kids Help Phone

When Kids Help Phone was first identified as a potential signature partner in 2022, we had a good feeling about it.

The partnership was a natural fit, addressing **two** of the Foundation's Pillars: **Mental Health** (our pillar of focus) and **Youth Issues**.

By supporting Counsellor in The Classroom and its community-based approach, we knew we'd be making a big difference to a lot of kids.

Counsellor in The Classroom is a free program offered to classes in Grades 4-12, designed to help students:

- gain a better understanding of mental health
- identify how / where they can seek support
- make a plan for how they can get help if they need it
- feel more confident in seeking support

Together, we empower youth, providing crucial mental health support and fostering resilience in our communities.

Case Study: Growing with Feed Scarborough

In 2023, our partnership with Feed Scarborough flourished. Dozens of staff used their Volunteer Day with the organization in diverse roles including warehouse assistance, garden clean-up and supporting their Fall Market.

Demonstrating our commitment to supporting Feed Scarborough's work, FCR's Cedarbrae and Parkway properties generously donated their own funds to the organization and Parkway also provided space for Feed Scarborough to promote their work on sustainable development.

Our relationship was also instrumental in their successful Giving Tuesday campaign, encouraging public donations.



2024/2025 Signature Partner:


